

ORDINANCE NO. 1961-3

An ordinance laying out, opening, and adopting as public streets in the Borough of West Newton, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania, lands to be known as Lee Street and Seymour Drive.

WHEREAS the owners of all of the land abutting on the land hereinafter described and to be known as Lee Street and Seymour Drive have, by petition, requested the Borough of West Newton, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania, to lay out, open and adopt the same as public streets and by said petition released said Borough from any and all liability which may arise by virtue thereof and,

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Borough of West Newton, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania, to lay out, open and adopt said land as public streets,

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained and enacted and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the Borough of West Newton, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

SECTION I - The following land which is hereby designated as Lee Street is hereby laid out, opened and adopted as a public street in the Borough of West Newton, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania:

LEE STREET - "Beginning at Maple Street at the northwest corner of land of Anna Balko on the West, and on the northeast corner of land of Joseph Schiftic, et ux. on the East, being 30 feet in width and extending back in a southeasterly direction of even width for a distance of 160 feet."

SECTION II - The following land which is hereby designated as Seymour Drive is hereby laid out, opened and adopted as a public street in the Borough of West Newton, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania:

SEYMOUR DRIVE - "Beginning at Lee Street at the southeast corner of land of Joseph Schiftic, et ux. on the north, and on the northwest corner of land of Robert F. Wington, et ux. on the south, being 40 feet in width and extending back in a northeasterly direction of even width for a distance of 120 feet."

SECTION III - Notice of the passage of this ordinance shall be given in addition to the advertisement hereof by the posting of handbills along Lee Street and Seymour Drive as above described within ten days from the passage of this ordinance. Said notice shall state that the petition was signed by the owners of all of the property abutting

upon said streets and that any person interested in denying the fact that such petition was so signed may appeal to the Court of Common Pleas of Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania, within thirty days after the passage of this ordinance.
