ORDINANCE NO.: 1984- 7

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING THE OFFER OF DEDICATION OF KENSINGTON COURT
AND SIMULTANEOUSLY LAYING OUT AND OPENING SAID KENSINGTON COURT AS
AN OFFICIAL BOROUGH STREET

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Town Council of the Borough of West Newton, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1: The Borough of West Newton hereby accepts the offer of dedication of Robert C. Baughman with respect to dedicating a street known as Kensington Court as shown on the Vernon Plan of Lots Phase 1 Subdivision which was approved by Borough Council on June 27, 1983 and recorded in Westmoreland County Recorder of Deeds Office in Plan Book Volume 87 page 790 on July 13, 1983.

SECTION 2: In accordance with Section 1731 of the Borough Code, the said Kensington Court as shown on said Vernon Plan of Lots Phase 1 which is recorded in Plan Book Volume 87 page 790 in the Recorder of Deeds Office of Westmoreland County is hereby simultaneously laid out and opened as an official Borough street.


SECTION 3: The President of West Newton Borough Council, the Borough Secretary and the Borough Solicitor are hereby authorized and directed to take whatever actions are required to comply with the applicable Borough Code sections dealing with the laying out and opening of the said Kensington

Court as shown on said Vernon Plan of Lots Phase 1 which is recorded in Plan Book Volume 87 page 790 in the Recorder of Deeds Office of Westmoreland County.


